As the school year comes to an end, many children will be spending their summer vacation at home unsupervised while their parents are at work. This summer, more kids than ever will spend time online, chatting with "friends" on social networking sites, playing on-line games, surfing the web and texting through their cellular phones.

Attorney General McCollum, along with FBI-SOS and Nova Southeastern University, will host a free cybersafety web presentation for parents on June 2, 2010 at 8:00 p.m. This web presentation will help parents understand online safety issues and provide practical information to assist them in keeping children safe on the internet. The presentation includes real-life examples of internet threats to children, information on how to spot internet child predators, and best practices for helping children stay safe while surfing online. During the presentation, parents will also be able to ask the Attorney General's CyberCrime Unit live questions.

"The more parents know about safe internet use, the better they can help protect our children from internet child predators," said Attorney General McCollum.
